Howell noted, "A strong musical education is very important to me and I already have a good foundation from having attended Booker T. and I would like to continue this intense training through college."

A signature event recognizing the launch of the Barnes & Thornburg Student Enrichment Fund will be held on Saturday, September 14. At the event, students will perform a medley of acts, including tap and contemporary dance, vocal jazz, and street mime and visual art performances.

Booker T. Washington High School for the Performing and Visual Arts

Prior to becoming a premier arts high school in the nation, Booker T. Washington High School produced outstanding alumni, such as Baseball Hall of Famer, Ernie Banks, the famed All-Century shortstop for the Chicago Cubs. A statue celebrating Mr. Banks, a Presidential Medal of Freedom Awardee, now holds an honored place on the grounds of his former Alma Mater.

Booker T. Washington High School for the Performing and Visual Arts is part of the Dallas Independent School District. This Texas Medal of the Arts honoree is the first secondary school in the district to be awarded the prestigious National Blue Ribbon Award for Exemplary Education from the Department of Education. Since 1976, the school has earned the distinction for Exemplary Arts Education from the Rockefeller Foundation, one of the Top 8 Magnet Schools in the country by the Department of Education, and one of the top 5 arts schools in the nation by the National Foundation for Advancement in the Arts, among others. downtown Dallas, in the heart of the Dallas Arts District.

The school has consistently earned national recognition in the arts: over 600 awards in dance, music, theater, visual arts, and creative writing through the National Foundation for Advancement in the Arts, 29 Presidential Scholars in the Arts, over 260 music DeeBee awards from Downbeat Magazine (the largest number of any school, including colleges and universities in North America), playwriting awards, and many others. The school's dual emphasis on the arts and academics continuously produces stellar graduates such as Edie Brickell, Grammy Awards winners Norah Jones, Erykah Badu, and the late Roy Hargrove, television actress Elizabeth Mitchell, visual artist, Christian Schumann, muralist, Chris Arnold, Broadway actress/dancer, Dylis Croman, American Ballet Theater dancer, Daniel Keene, and Theater Residency Artist, Gesel Mason.
