In March 2013, he was reappointed to that federal advisory committee and was named co-chair of that federal advisory committee's Internet Protocol Transition Working Group.

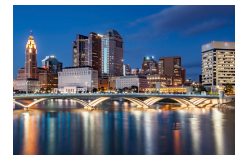

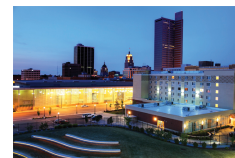

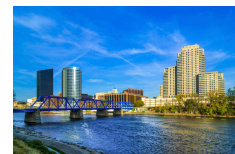
